FINANCIAL UPDATE: Good news--Through September, our bottom line is almost \$25,000 better than budget estimates, due mainly to higher pledge and plate income. Through 75% of the year, we have collected 81% of budgeted pledge income. Not so good news---our capital fund balances are less than \$14,000. Several projects complete and others on the horizon.
