

GLOBAL MISSIONS MINISTRY

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

When disaster strikes we all feel compelled to help, but sometimes it is hard to know where to send the help.

In past years, your Global Missions Ministry has usually taken relief funds from a small "to be decided" line in the budget and channeled them through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). This takes away our ability to help out in other areas such as covering the costs associated with visits from mission coworkers, to help with funding those setting out for mission work, or helping to fund trips to and from our partner church in Guatemala. This year we took a hard look and made the decision to include \$2,000 towards disaster aid in our budget. This money will go to PDA as it is needed.

PDA is on the ground not only in the USA but in countries around the world, where they work in cooperation with local churches and other responders. By working with groups that already have a presence in the affected area they can provide aid right where it is needed. They can also understand the needs and the culture of the local people. It is often the churches that offer the most effective and sustained effort in response to human suffering. They are not only there when disaster strikes but continue to be there for the long haul, long after most organizations and most of us have moved on to another disaster. PDA, through its partnerships, understands what is needed and is in a position to "hit the ground running".

Theological Education Fund

For many years Trinity, through the Global Missions Ministry, has contributed to PC(USA's) Theological Education Fund. Gifts help support eleven PC(USA) seminaries from coast to coast. Everyday life has changed significantly since the first PC(USA) theological seminaries were founded. Over the years, additional theological institutions were established, carrying on the Presbyterian tradition of providing educated leadership for congregations.

Administered through the Presbyterian Foundation, contributions go to:

- Prepare men and women to be pastors, educators and musicians for congregations.
- Provide continuing education and advanced degree programs for ministers of the Word and Sacrament and for lay church leaders.
- Serve as centers for theological discourse, reflection and research for the benefit of the wider church during changing times.

In February of this year, we will be contributing \$1,000 to the Theological Education Fund.


