# session notes:

The Session held its regular meeting by Zoom on December 14. Rev. Mark Stanley opened the meeting with prayer. The Session was joined by officers-elect Billie Hicklin, Steve Culp, Mary Culp, Leslie Nissen, Jeffrey Sheffield, and Jocelyn Tolleson, as well as Andy Nissen, a deacon-nominee.

Diane Bowers presented the report of the Finance/Stewardship Ministry, noting that there is a remaining balance from the Paycheck Protection Program loan. The Finance Ministry is thoroughly evaluating potential uses of that remaining balance.

The joint report of the Worship Ministry and the Task Force on Re-opening the church building was presented, with the motion to approve continuing the current limit of seven members participating in each of the two Sunday morning building worship services until February 1. This motion was approved, with 15 in favor, and 1 opposed. Glenn Walker asked that his opposing vote be specifically recorded in the minutes.

As noted in November, we will need to elect additional officers. The Congregational Meeting to elect new officers will be held Wednesday, January 20 at 7pm by Zoom.

The ordination and installation of officers will be filmed January 27 at 1pm, and will be shared with the congregation beginning on Sunday, January 31.

The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on February 14 at 1pm by Zoom. **Ministries' annual reports should be submitted by January 15** in preparation for this meeting.

Session approved, with 15 votes in favor, and one opposed, the use of the kitchen for a Safe-light Event on Christmas Day, with masks, to be supervised by Lin Carlson.

Each of the incoming elders and deacons present shared their faith journey.

Hi Glenn,

*I am a member of the congregational relations committee and board of directors at the Interfaith Assistance Ministry or IAM.*

*I want to thank you and let you know how grateful IAM is for your congregation's ongoing support of our mission. Throughout the pandemic, the need in Henderson County has become greater than ever before.*

*Through October we have served almost 18,000 children and adults, as compared to nearly 14,000 last year. Many of them needed help just one time,*

*Unfortunately, as the pandemic continues, the need for food, financial assistance for utility bills and rent, clothing, prescriptions, personal hygiene items, blankets, linens, towels, gasoline vouchers, bus tickets and other hardships is growing. Our Drive-Thru Tuesday food distribution is steadily increasing. We serve over 150 families each week within a two and one-hour period, representing 600 to 700 individuals with traditional or Latino food orders. Most of the vans and cars that drive through include children.*

*Please let your members, Missions Committee leader, your congregation's treasurer or whomever is responsible for the assistance provided to IAM know that we thank them immensely on behalf of the thousands of neighbors in need of assistance. We could not sustain our 36-year-old ministry without your support.*

*Thank you again for helping IAM assist so many hurting and hungry families. Your gifts to IAM are providing hope, heat on cold winter nights, relieving hunger pain and preventing new homelessness.*

## Financial Update

November's bottom line was essentially break-even. We remain favorable to budget and unfavorable to November 2019 YTD actual. Both income and expense remain under budget due to our Preschool not in session.

Plate offerings were lower than budget. Counting the almost \$14,000 in over and above giving by some members, through 92% of the year, we have received 94.6% of budgeted pledges. We will be working on December 31<sup>st</sup> to process all remaining donations. If you mail them in, please allow sufficient time for them to reach us by Wednesday, December 30<sup>th</sup>.

At the end of the month, there was almost \$3300 in the TPS yard sale income account, primarily due to Books for Good receipts. The year-end balance in this account will be transferred to a yard sale fund account so it can be used in 2021 to support TPS budget support and their tuition assistance account.

Combined balances in our Capital accounts total \$37,100.

There is still continued uncertainty about our 2021 pledge campaign results. We still have some pledge requests outstanding.





